Progress Association Forum

THE ANNUAL PROGRESS ASSOCIATION FORUM WAS HELD IN PORT AUGUSTA ON 15-16 NOVEMBER.

The forum was well attended, with 23 community representatives from 14 communities across Outback SA attending, from as far away as Innamincka, Marla and Fowlers Bay.

These forums provide a rare opportunity for OCA staff and board members to meet with people from across the region and work together on common issues. Crucially though, these forums are also valuable for enabling connections between outback residents who would rarely get a chance to meet. For Sheree Turner from Blinman, the forum provided a valuable opportunity to gain perspective from fellow outback residents:

"Forums like this allow you to find commonality and share the joy of living in outback towns, surrounded by nature. They are also reaffirming and give you strength to meet some of the challenges of living in the outback and help you think more clearly about the future."

The Forum commenced on Friday 15 November at the Standpipe with a welcome to country provided by Barngarla woman Jonas Dare, followed by dinner and the Outback SA Quiz, a fun opportunity for everyone to meet, mingle and learn some new facts about Outback SA (including, of course, the location of many of the OCA's magnificent toilet blocks). On the Saturday, a series of talks and workshops were held enabling information-sharing about current OCA activities, and a chance to explore improvements to the working relationship between communities and the OCA.

- Presiding Member Jan Ferguson OAM provided the opening address, giving the attendees insight into the political context in which the OCA and Outback SA operate.
- A fascinating Community Showcase followed, in which people from each community used a series of images to talk about what they valued most about their community.
- OCA Director Marg Howard provided a presentation about current progress towards the Strategic Blueprint, and led a workshop to unpack the inter-connected nature of the issues identified in the Blueprint.
- Simone Brock and Grayson Cooke gave a presentation about the new Outback SA website currently in development as part of the Outback SA regional and community identity project.
- The final sessions of the day explored the relationship between the OCA and Progress Associations, assessing
 what is currently working and what is not, and looking at ways communications and operational matters can be
 optimised.
- The day ended with dinner at Tickle Belly Hill and a fascinating "interview with pictures" with photographer Dave Laslett, who has been commissioned to produce images for the Outback SA signage project across the region.
