Storms and Floods throughout the District



A narrow storm band lashed properties in the North East on 12th January, with roofs lost and trees uprooted. Properties impacted included Curnamona, Bindarrah, Wiawera and Lilydale.

Jenny Treloar reported that the Wiawera RFDS clinic suffered damage to the dental room and homestead trees uprooted. She said the volume of the thunder and the closeness of the lightning was "pretty scary" and lasted about 20 minutes.

Lilydale manager Alastaire Lindner said that the woolshed and other buildings lost large sections of roofing with quite a degree of damage in the vicinity – and a poly tank yet to be found!

The Curnamona woolshed also lost half its roof with owner Bruce Nutt saying it was an eerie sight.

Rain storms swept through again on 28th January with Wadnaminga's Jim Treloar reporting 70mm of rain falling within 2 hours. The Yunta and Winnininnie Creeks running 'bankers' and flood-outs in paddocks over a wide area. Sections of the rail line were also damaged in parts.

RFDS patients are invited to book clinic appointments online

To make booking for RFDS clinics easier, patients can begin using the service HotDoc. They can see what appointment times are available, plus choose and book appointments quickly and confidentially at a convenient time. At present, only the Yunta clinic is trialling the system.

Customers will still be able to call their Clinic Coordinator and they will be able to book through HotDoc on your behalf, or call the Clive Bishop Medical Centre to book appointments.

This system will allow RFDS staff to manage appointments, patients' needs and requirements to be taken on the plane for the clinic e.g. vaccinations, dressings etc.

South Australian Ministers visit the North East

On 13 January Yunta was visited by Hon. Dan van Holst Pellekaan MP (Deputy Premier of SA, Minister for Energy and Mining & Member for Stuart) and Hon. Vincent Tarzia MP (Minister for Police, Corrections and Emergency Services) in their travels to the north east part of their electorate. Their tour also took them to Peterborough, Oodla Wirra, Mannahill, Olary, Cockburn and Wiawera.

During their visit in Yunta, the Ministers attended the Telecentre, CFS Shed, Caltex, Mobil, Yunta Police Station and the Yunta Hotel. They also added visits to the Yunta Aerodrome to view the progress on the re-sheeting project and the Race Club to view the progress of the rebuild project. It was nice to be able to share the efforts of our volunteers and they certainly appeared impressed with what they saw!

Ken Campbell, Black Rock CFS Group Officer and Peter Ickonopolos, Region 4 Outback Areas Officer attended the CFS shed visit and were able to provide insight into issues, concerns and priorities for the CFS including flow on impacts to the Yunta brigade. Inspector Mark Collise was also in attendance as part of the visit to the Yunta Police Station.

Community members were able to

provide the Ministers with historical and relevant information about each location visited and raise any areas of concern or interest.

Hot topics covered across the day included outback roads, emergency services support, the OCA Outback Futures funding model, the challenge of attracting and retaining staff and volunteers in the future, communications technology and the lack of reliable communication services within Yunta and surrounds.

We hope the Ministers found their visit valuable and provided insight into matters relevant to our community.

The OCA is responsible for the maintenance of the Barrier Highway public toilets in the North East. It is planned that significant refurbishments of the Yunta and Mannahill toilets, as well as significant repairs to the Olary Public Toilets will begin in February.

Mark Sutton reported that "the OCA is investing in the refurbishment of the Yunta public toilets which will include renewal of all fittings and fixtures along with internal and external painting. This work is currently scheduled for February 2022, and will help improve local and visitor experience when using the facilities."


In December 2021 the Outback Communities

Do you think these electricity protections meet your needs? What other protections would you like to see? Would you like to talk to us about your electricity protections?



Billing and payment



- · You get your electricity bill at least every three months.
- Your bill describes what you are paying for.
- You have 12 business days to pay.
- You can ask your supplier to check your bill if you think it's wrong and get a fair response.
- · You can pay your bill in person or by mail.
- Some people can also pay by direct debit or CentrePay.
- If you need help paying, you can ask to make a payment plan.
- If you make a payment plan and keep making payments, your electricity won't be cut off.

Interruptions



- You will get a written notice if your electricity will be off for a while.
- If you don't get a notice, you can ask why your electricity was off.

Disconnections



- If your electricity gets cut off because you haven't paid, you can make a payment plan.
- When you have made a payment plan, you can ask for your electricity to be put back on.
- You will get your electricity back that day or the next business day.

Complaints



- You can complain about your bill or service to your supplier.
- Your supplier must respond to your complaint within a month.
- If you are unhappy with their response, you can ask the SA Energy and Water Ombudsman to help. https://ewosa.com.au/

Prepaying for your electricity

Your electricity supplier may soon offer you the choice to prepay. With prepay, you pay for your electricity before you use it, instead of paying after you've used it and when you get your bill.

If you choose to prepay, your supplier must:



- explain how prepay works and tell you all the costs
- get your consent to prepay
- tell you how to use the prepay method on you meter, so you can see how much credit you
 have left
- give you some emergency credit if your prepayments run out
- keep your electricity connected on weekends and before 10am and after 3pm on weekdays,
 even when your prepayments and emergency credit have run out
- change you back to post-payment without any cost, so you can pay after you use your electricity.

New and Exciting RFDS Booking System for Yunta Clinic

Yunta is the first of the RFDS SE section clinics to work with a new booking system.

RFDSSE is always working on ways to improve our services to our communities. With our communities in mind, we are looking to improve our booking system for our clinics.

The RFDSSE is rolling out an App called HOTDOC https://help.hotdoc.com.au/hc/en-gb/articles/204364254-How-do-I-book-an-appointment-with-my-practitioner-. This is a link that explains what it is and how you use it. It is a private and confidential, no one else can see who is booked in only the Doctor and Nurses, also means you can book your own appointments 24 hours 7 days a week, when booking you will only see blank spots where appointments time are available, and you can choose and book your appointment quickly and confidentially at a time that is convenient to you.

Customers at the Yunta clinic can use this system to book for the Clinic on the 17^{th of} February 2022

Customers will still be able to call the Clinic Coordinator as they will be able to book through Hotdoc on behalf of the customer or Clive Bishop Medical Centre to book appointment

Rain could increase pig numbers in the North East

Reports of pig sightings received by the SA Arid Lands Landscape Board has increased considerably in the outback channel country, with Queensland floodwaters pushing into South Australia posing a further risk to the spread of pigs. With increased rainfall in the North East Pastoral District, now is the time to keep an eye out for any signs of activity and let us know.

We're also in the process of creating a North East Pastoral District group on the Feral Scan app where you can enter pig sightings and communicate with your neighbours about how they are tackling the issue. Pig numbers have been minimised across the North East through the hard work of land managers and now is the time to be vigilant and monitor and act on any increase in populations.

We are keen to minimise feral pig incursions in the North East and I am keen to assist land managers with signs of recent pig activity to consider management options. NSW Local Land Services are offering the webinar "How much are feral pigs impacting your bottom line?" Register to watch on February 2 or to receive an emailed recording.
