### **OCA Members visit Yunta**

Members and staff of the Outback Communities Authority met with members of the Yunta District Hall committee at the Race Clubhouse on 5th May with eight people from each body attending. The purpose of the visit was to further discuss areas of the proposed Outback Futures Project.

After a tour of the clubhouse, OCA Presiding Member Mr Bill McIntosh commended the Yunta Race Club members and volunteers on the tremendous achievement of the new building. Bill had twice visited the project during the build process and had enthusiastically expressed his admiration of the undertaking.



The drafting of the Outback Futures Project has involved widespread consultative community meetings and communiques over the past two years.

The Board was questioned about the sustainability and equitable setting of a proposed Outback Levy which remains a contentious issue.

Following the meeting, Board members inspected Yunta's newly re-sheeted airstrip before returning to Pt Augusta. Hall President Allen Hucks thanked the Board for their interest in the Yunta community and their willingness to further discuss the proposed Outback Futures Project.

### Re-vamped Airstrip Re-opened

Guests, RFDS staff and local residents braved icv winds to attend the airstrip re-opening on 30<sup>th</sup> May.

State Member for Stuart Geoff Brock and YDH Secretary Lisa Crawford cut the ribbon before the 25 attending scurried to the comfort of the Yunta Hall where the official speeches were followed by a lunch.

The major runway repairs and re-sheeting of the Yunta Aerodrome was instigated and overseen by the Yunta Hall Committee with Australian Government's Remote Airstrip Upgrade Program funding of \$156,503, which was matched by SA State Government funding.

## **Production to Recommence at Honeymoon Uranium Mine**

It has been announced that uranium production will resume by the end of next year at the Honeymoon uranium mine.

Boss Energy announced that it has signed off on a \$113 million upgrade of the mine north of Cockburn, after previous plans to revive the mine were shelved in 2013 because of low uranium prices and high production costs.

Production is expected to begin by December 2023 with Boss Energy saying it will produce 2.5 million tonnes of uranium annually by 2026.

In a statement to the ASX, Boss Energy said it had raised capital for the project through \$125 million in share sales in March.

The company's managing director, Duncan Craib, and director Bryn Jones briefed South Australian Mining Minister Tom Koutsantonis on the project last week.

"This final investment decision puts

Boss firmly on track to be Australia's next uranium producer," Mr Craib said.



"We are fully funded with no debt, fully permitted and (have) extensive infrastructure in place.

"Our front-end engineering studies are completed and we are ready to order key equipment and start construction immediately.





immediate future, but also for many years to come. Your vision, attention to detail and persistence and skills in administering such a large project, are a wonderful example to the rest of the outback region, showing what can be achieved when communities really work together.

The OCA also appreciated the opportunity to meet and hopefully address some of the concerns expressed by Yunta community members regarding the OCA's recommendation for a shared responsibility model for the Outback. As I hope was clearly articulated, it is intended that these recommendations will be made only on the proviso that the State Government commits to fully fund public benefit services in the Outback and also matches any funds raised by Outback residents to pay for services that support those resident Outback communities.

The Outback Futures Project has been complex and required much consideration by the OCA over the last couple of years on how to ensure the Outback is thriving and vibrant well into the future. Our Board have remained committed to listening to all the feedback received throughout the consultation process and I would like to thank all the Yunta community members who took the time and effort to provide comments for the OCA to consider.

As you are aware, final advice will be provided to the Minister for Local Government at the end of this month and will soon after, be made available to the Outback Community including the Yunta District Hall and anyone who has registered to be updated on the progress of the Outback Futures Project.

I thank you again for your time and hospitality. I believe the OCA found the meeting very valuable in considering its recommendations, particularly in demonstrating the uniqueness of each outback community and the need to consider issues of equity, between and within those communities."
